CUSTOMER SATISFACTION SURVEY SUMMARY THANKS TO EVERYONE THAT PARTICIPATED!

Last year, the District conducted a Customer Satisfaction Survey. We are pleased to report these results, along with an explanation of some of the questions raised in the survey:

70% felt that their customer service experiences are above average;
Over 60% felt that the water and sewer system services are above average;
Over 50% felt that their tap water quality is above average;
70% felt that their level of services provided are above average; and
32% felt that their value of services in comparison to monthly billing is above average and 51% felt the value was average.

RECREATION FEE: The fee helps offset the cost to operate and maintain not only the pool but the Sun Valley Neighborhood Center and the 4 parks (Sun Valley Community, Gepford, Highland Ranch & Sun Mesa), along with sponsoring and participating in community events. Senior citizens age 65 or older may receive a 20% discount off this fee, and qualifying District customers may receive a 100% discount off this fee. Please contact the District office for more information.

POOL PROGRAMS: The District has expanded activities and programs offered at the pool each year to try to maximize participation while balancing cost. We urge you to continue letting us know what other things you'd like to see at the pool by contacting the District office.

RATES: Customers new to the District often ask why their water bill is so high. Once we explain that their bills include not only water but sewer and recreation, it clarifies this. The monthly water rates are \$22.23 base and \$2.34 per 1,000 gallons consumption. The monthly sewer rates are \$17.14 base and \$4.29 per 1,000 gallons consumption. The monthly recreation fee is \$3.02.

WATER QUALITY: All water in Sun Valley is pre-treated and purified by Truckee Meadows Water Authority (TMWA).

The District monitors the water quality every day. Our professional staff checks all water storage tanks every day, monitors the levels and pumping with our SCADA (Supervisor Control and Data Acquisition) system and has an extensive flushing and maintenance program. In addition, we take 20 water quality samples around the valley every month that are tested by the Nevada State Health Laboratory. We also monitor the chlorine residual and turbidity levels and are well within state and federal standards. If at any time you notice a change in the taste, odor, or clarity of your drinking water, please call our offices and we will be happy to test the water. All water quality data is available free of charge upon customer request. WASHOE COUNTY SERVICES: There were several comments regarding the maintenance and condition of the roads and ditches within the valley. These items fall under Washoe County Roads Department. It is the time of year to start thinking about weatherizing your home for winter weather and cold temperatures. Avoiding broken or frozen pipes saves money and inconvenience. Brochures are available at the District office on "Winterizing Your Water Pipes". But If you do encounter frozen pipes in your home, thaw them out slowly and be aware that when pipes freeze and break you may not notice the break until they are thawed and water is allowed to flow freely. The District has a service technician available 24 hours a day to respond to your home and turn off the water in case of an emergency or for you to make necessary repairs.
