


REMEMBERING - GARTH ELLIOTT

DON'T FORGET TO WINTERIZE

The District would like to remind you to prepare for freezing temperatures that could create frozen and/or possibly broken water pipes. A few simple precautions to take are to keep your plumber's phone number handy, disconnect and drain outdoor hoses and swamp coolers, know where your master shut off valve is to your home, and make sure to insulate your water pipes or any water pipes that are exposed to the freezing temperatures. SUN VALLEY POOL & RECREATION

The recreation season started off with the 7th Annual Dive into Summer event with a movie in the park featuring Hotel Transylvania 2 and the opening of the Robert & Norma Fink Sun Valley Pool. The Sun Valley Pool Aquatics staff did an excellent job this past summer, overseeing the pool and keeping our patrons safe. The 2019 pool season extended over a total of 9 weeks and had 381 registered youth swim lessons during the 3 sessions. The Parent & Me swim lesson was a huge success and will be offered again in the summers to come. Over 1,000 patrons in total attended the three swim days hosted by the Fink Family, Assemblywoman Benitez-Thompson Washoe and Commissioner Kitty Jung. The pool fun culminated in an end of summer pool party, followed by Family Classics held their 2nd Annual Show & Shine at the Sun Valley Community Park. The District wishes to thank all the donors and sponsors who helped add to the festivities and events this past recreation season.

ILLEGALLY DUMPED VEHICLES
