**WATER SERVICE LINE AND FACILITIES INSTALLED BY CUSTOMERS
IN SPECIAL CASES**

I. SPECIAL CASES

In special cases where extension of the District's mains to a point adjacent to Customer's premises is not feasible in the opinion of the District, Customer may lay service pipe, at his own expense, from point of use to point where tap can be made directly to District's then existing main.

In such cases, the District shall be obligated to maintain reasonable pressure and quantity of flow at the point of connection to its main only, and Customer shall assume all responsibility and cost for maintenance, operation and replacement of his service line and the pressure and flow therein.

If additional facilities, including but not limited to a booster pump, should be required in Customer's service line to provide adequate pressure for Customer's service, above the pressure delivered normally at the point of connection of Customer's service line to the District's main, Customer shall provide, operate, maintain and replace such facilities, at his own expense.

The District shall at no time in the future be required to lay additional main beyond the original point of delivery to supply water to said Customer or other supplied through said Customer's service.

Original Customers shall pay all charges for water delivered through his service, at point of connection to the main, whether to his own premises those of others which may be connected to such service.
