- I) Amend Rule No. 17 updating to District's Service Territory.
- Amend Rule No. 20 providing updates to Section 1.B.1 regarding joint metered properties subject to conversion; amending Section IA and IB clarifying Multi-Unit definition and assessment of Multi-Unit charge; adding language that provides additional clarification regarding eligibility for exemption from conversion; and amending Section II to include language regarding what type of dwelling unit is eligible for a Master Meter for Future Services.
- Amend Rule No. 21 implementing a 2.5% previously approved increase for residential K) and commercial single use water consumption rate from \$2.46 to \$2.52 up to 6,000 gal; adopting Tier 2 rate of \$3.61 for greater than 6,000 gal; adopting Irrigation Rate of \$3.61 per gal; increasing bulk single use from \$3.44 to \$3.61; amending Section II.C to clarify facility fees to be changed "per unit" rather than per connection; adding language to require facility fees to be paid at the time of District approval of parcel map and/or time of water project submittal to Nevada Department of Environmental Protection or Washoe County Health Department: amending Section I.F to bill Infirm Care Units the same as Multi-Units; amending Section I.G to adopt of monthly flat fee of up to \$3.00 per unit in place of a percentage to be assessed on Non-Taxpaving customers to help fund capital improvement projects and ensure consistency in burden for that purpose with unincorporated District customer; adding a new subsection to I.G regarding City of Sparks Right-Of-Way fee of 5%, on water consumption only, for customers located in the incorporated city service area; removing Section II.D.5 regarding Domestic Irrigation Services, amending Section III.B to discontinue after-hour non-payment reinstalls after 4:30 pm; removing Section III.B regarding re-deposit needed for commercial accounts; and including additional language throughout Rule to include apartment complex services.
- L) Amend Rule No. 22 regarding Sewer Rates and Fees increasing the base rate from \$17.14 to \$19.00; increasing sewer consumption frate from \$4.29 to \$4.50; adopting a flat sewer fee of \$41.50 per unit for apartment complexes and mobile home parks serviced by a master meter; amending Section I.K to bill Infirm Care Units the same as Multi-Units; amending IV.C regarding New Customer Set-Up to be consistent with language in Rule 21; amending Section III.B to clarify base rate is to be charged "per unit" rather than per connection; amending Section V.B.2 to clarify facility fee to be charged "per unit" rather than per connection; adding language to Section V.C requiring facility Fees to be paid at the time of District approval of parcel map and/or at time of sewer project submittal to Nevada Department of Environmental Protection or Washoe County Health Department; amending Section V.E clarifying commercial sewer inspections are performed and billed by the City of Sparks; removing Section VI regarding Domestic Irrigation Service; and adding language throughout Rule to include

- apartment complex service.
- M) Amend Rule No. 23 Section V to remove Facility Damage Fee of \$250.00 from the rule and adding it to the Utility Fee Schedule; adding a new Section VI to include language regarding the District's unclaimed property procedure; amending the Utility Fee Schedule increasing the 2" Backflow Inspection fee from \$40.00 to \$200.00; adding fee of \$300.00 for great than 2" Backflow Inspection; increasing Parcel Map Review from \$50.00 to \$100.00; increasing Commercial, Subdivision, and Apartment Map Review from \$250.00 to \$500.00; adding \$750.00 for Annexation Application Review; and removing the Unclaimed Property Dormancy Charge.
- N) Amend Rule No. 24 to remove Annexation Fee of \$750 from the rule and adding it to the Utility Fee Schedule.
- O) Amending Rule No. 26 to remove Exhibit of the Rate Schedule and including language referring customers to Northern Nevada Washoe County Waste Management website for current garbage rates.
- P) Amend Rule No. 28 regarding Recreation Fee to increase from \$3.50 to \$4.00; amending Section III.B include language assessing the recreation fee to all dwelling units, apartment units and customers located in the incorporated city service area; removing a portion from Section III.B regarding Recreation Program Refunds from Deposits/Refund; amending the Recreation Fee Schedule by increasing the youth per player fee from \$15.00 to \$20.00; increasing the adult per player fee from \$20.00 to \$25.00; and removing Gepford Community Building from Recreation Fee Schedule.
